

BOOK BUZZ

Bonnie Easton

The Alternatives: A Novel by Caoilinn Hughes is the story of four adult Irish sisters who were orphaned when their parents died under tragic circumstances, but all grew up to earn Ph.D. degrees in their chosen fields and live in different parts of the world. Now single women in their thirties, they live separate lives until the eldest disappears and does not seem to want to be found. She is somewhere in the Irish countryside. The three younger sisters travel together to the home of their birth to face their past and mend old wounds.

The debut novel by Irish author Colin Barrett, *Wild Houses*, is a tale of drug dealers and thugs, but it is also a character study of a loner, Dev Hendrick, who is coerced into assisting in a kidnapping. Gabe and Sketch Ferdia, Dev's hotheaded cousins, are enforcers for a local drug dealer Cillian English and he owes them money, so they beat up and kidnap Cillian's younger brother, Doll, and hide him in Dev's cottage in the country in County Mayo. Dev earns an income by letting his cousins stash drugs in his home. Doll's 17-year-old girlfriend discovers he is missing and is also trying to find him. While Doll is staying with Dev, they become unlikely friends, like a Stockholm Syndrome scenario. All this leads to a complicated situation with the potential for humorous moments.

Author Kristin Gleeson was born in Philadelphia and now resides in West Cork. She holds a master's degree in library science and a Ph.D. in history. Her Women in Ireland series consists of two books: In Praise of the Bees: A Literary Historical Novel of Medieval Ireland and The Song of the Bees: A Literary Historical Novel of Medieval Ireland. In Praise of the Bees is set in the community of the nuns of St. Gobnait's in Ireland in 590 A.D. A woman is discovered beaten and almost dead and has lost all memory of her identity. The nuns name her Aine and give her sanctuary. Slowly, Aine's memory begins to return, and the horror of her story emerges. Will the nuns be able to keep her safe from those who pursue her? Would she be safe anywhere? The Song of the Bees moves us to 1349 and again is set in St Gobnait's nunnery. Meadbh is a novice studying to become a nun, but her training is interrupted when she must return home to care for her ailing father and leave the peace she has found with the sisters. The escort for her journey is a man with the skills of a warrior. What Meadbh encounters in the world to which she is returning is the chaos of war, the plague, and frequent periods of famine with a fragile balance of power between the Irish and the Anglo-Irish. Women had few choices in those days to control their own fate.

To change the subject, there is a new autobiography of a modern woman. For WWE fans, there is *Becky Lynch: The*

Man: Not Your Average Average Girl by Rebecca Quin. This memoir tells of a young woman, born in Limerick, who started as an Aer Lingus flight attendant and recounts an honest and personal story of how she develops into a star in the world of pro wrestling. She was a member of WWE from 2013-2024 and is now a free agent and an American citizen.

Oldies but goodies for this month: *The Wonder* by Emma Donoghue, *Ireland* by Frank Delaney, *Say Nothing* (nonfiction) by Patrick Radden Keefe, *The Year of the French* and *Tenants of Time* by Thomas Flanagan, and the *Sgt. Sean Duffy* series of thrillers by Northern Irish author Adrian McKinty.


