

Movie Buzz Bonnie Easton

Just for this month, I am changing the title to *Movie Buzz* since there are several movies and television shows being released that star Irish actors, take place in Ireland, or tell a story based on a book by an Irish author.

Small Things Like These stars Oscar winner Cillian Murphy (**Oppenheimer**) from a book written by Irish author Claire Keegan. In 1985, a devoted father who works as a coal merchant in a small town discovers disturbing secrets kept by the local convent and uncovers shocking truths of his own.

Murphy will also star in a new Netflix production of *Peaky Blinders* that is based on the beloved British TV series (2013-2022). It may be titled *The Immortal Man* and also stars Tim Roth and Barry Keoghan. The series centered around an English crime boss and his gang in 1919. No info has been released yet about this latest installment, but it is rumored to take place during World War II.

Four Letters of Love, based on the 2015 book by Niall Williams, stars Pierce Brosnan, Gabriel Byrne, and Helena Bonham Carter. Nicholas and Isabel were both born into families struck by tragedy, but fate has decided that they were meant for each other. A series of chance events and a miracle are needed to convince them to follow their hearts.

Say Nothing is a nine-part mini-series streaming on Hulu and Disney+. It is based on a bestselling book by Patrick Radden Keefe that was named one of the 20 Best Books of the 20th century by The New York Times. The topic is the bitter conflict in Northern Ireland and the violence there. Jean Conville, a single mother of 10, is abducted from her home in 1972 and never seen alive again. This event unfolds alongside the stories of various Irish Republican Army members, spanning four decades during the Troubles. It stars Lola Petticrew, Hazel Doupe, Anthony Boyle, Josh Finan, and Maxine Peake.

Popular Irish actress Saoirse Ronan is starring in *Blitz*. A nine-year old boy is evacuated to the countryside from London during World War II to escape the Nazi bombing raids, but young George is determined to return to his family and attempts a precarious journey home as his mother searches for him. Available on Apple TV and Hulu.

Another new Pierce Brosnan film is *The Thursday Murder Club*, which is based on the first of five volumes of a mystery series written by Richard Osman. It boasts a star-studded cast—Jonathan Pryce, David Tennant, Helen Mirren, and Ben Kingsley. Four residents of a peaceful retirement community in England enjoy solving cold murder cases, but they find themselves with a real murder to solve in their own community. Directed by Chris Columbus.

Black Bag will be released in March 2025. It stars Northern Irish actor Michael Fassbender supported by Tom Burke, Cate Blanchett, and, once again, Pierce Brosnan. When intelligence agent Kathryn Woodhouse is suspected of betraying her country, her husband George, also an agent, is forced to choose between loyalty to his wife and loyalty to his country. Release date is March 24, 2025. Directed by Steven Soderbergh and filmed in London.


